## Melvin E. Walker, Jr.

## Retired Professor of Agricultural Economics and Economics

Melvin E. Walker, Jr. was born on October 23, 1946, in Shivers, Mississippi. He attended Lily Hill Elementary School and graduated from New Hymn High School, Pinola, Mississippi in 1965. He received the Associate of Science degree from Prentiss Junior College, Prentiss, Mississippi in 1967; the B.S. degree in General Agriculture from Alcorn State College, Lorman, Mississippi in 1969; and the M.S. and the Ph.D. degrees in Agricultural Economics from the University of Illinois in 1971 and 1973, respectively.

Walker joined The Fort Valley State University in 1973 as Assistant Professor of Agricultural Economics and was appointed Coordinator of Rural Development Research in 1974. He was named Director of the Agricultural Research Station and promoted to the ranks of Associate Professor and Professor in 1978 and 1984, respectively. He was appointed Dean and Research Director, College of Agriculture, Home Economics and Allied Programs on September 1, 1987. He was appointed Acting President effective October 1, 1988, and returned to the positions of Dean and Research Director on August 9, 1990 where he served until 1998. He served as professor of Agricultural Economics from 1998 to 2007 and as Professor of Economics from 2007 until retirement in December, 2012.

He has published extensively in the areas of Agricultural Economics and Rural Sociology. Among his publications are: "Economic Effects of a Total Farm Nitrogen Balance Approach to Reductions of Potential Nitrate Pollution," "Poverty and Alienation: A Case Study," "Yield and Income Variability for Selected Georgia Crops," "Are Rural Service Agencies Reaching the People with the Greatest Needs?," "The Culture of Poverty among Families in Rural Georgia," and "Powerlessness and Its Effects on Social Participation."

He holds membership in a number of professional and civic organizations and has served on many regional and national committees.
