# Juliette B. Bell Appointed President of University of Maryland Eastern Shore Dr. Bell is An Accomplished Academic Leader and Biochemist

Dr. Juliette B. Bell has been appointed as president of the University of the University of Maryland Eastern Shore.

Bell is provost and vice president for academic affairs at Central State University in Wilberforce, OH. Her appointment is effective July 1, 2012. Bell, a biochemist, is recognized as a strong advocate for increasing the number of minority scientists. She has dedicated much of her career to providing opportunities for students to participate in scientific research.

Dr. Bell has 20 years of higher education experience. Prior to joining Central State, she was interim provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs at Winston-Salem State University. A Talladega, AL native, Bell was the first in her family to attend college, earning a bachelor's degree in chemistry from Talladega College. She earned her Ph.D. in chemistry with a biochemistry concentration from Atlanta University (now Clark-Atlanta University) and post-doctorate in biochemistry from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Following her post-doctoral fellowship, she worked as a senior staff fellow and as a research biologist at the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences in Research Triangle Park, NC.



In 1992, she began her higher education teaching and research career in chemistry as a Department of Natural Sciences faculty member and director of biomedical research at Fayetteville State University. There, she advanced to serving as founding dean of the university's College of Basic and Applied Sciences from 2004 to 2006 and as provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs from 2006-2008 prior to her interim appointment at Winston-Salem State.

### Federal Budget and Farm Bill Updates

The Senate Agriculture, Forestry, and Nutrition Committee have marked up the 2012 Farm Bill and reported the bill to the full Senate for further consideration. Everything requested by the ARD has <u>been favorably received</u>. That would include the McIntire-Stennis language to state that "The matching funds requirement shall not be applicable to eligible 1890 Institutions if the allocation is below \$200,000." What the committee did not accept, as was requested by the 1862s, is to increase the NIFA indirect cost rate. The Committee left it at the 2008 rate of 22%.

Thus far the Senate FY2013 Markup Appropriations Bill leaves the formula funds the 1890s receive at the same level as was received for FY2012. Will keep you informed if changes come forth.
