- II. Acceptance of February Meeting Minutes Mark Williams and Michel Demanche
 - a. Dr. Bell- She met with Drs. Johnson and Cooledge and has a few updates. Issues that were discussed at Senate- enrollment is one of the major concerns, working to address that issue, opportunities to grow 4039 students is the target for next fall. Enrollment count is almost 1700 students enrolled for next fall right now. Bring in 900 new freshmen, and increase enrollment of transfer students.
 - b. We will have to make budget adjustments- ways to close the gap from this year's shortfall, will work on it to June 30th, Working on FYI 18 budget of filling or eliminating vacant positions
 - c. There will be a town hall meeting tonight from 6:00 to 7:30 focusing on students and changes in police jurisdiction in off campus housing. The town leader of Princess Anne will be there. There are concerns about housing. The University will reduce the foot print. We want to fill our own campus housing first. Due to the lower enrollment, we had empty housing on campus. We are planning on reducing off campus housing and increase the use of on campus housing. We need to meet our financial obligations as well. She is expressing thanks for all that we do.
