Her style is greatly influenced by her Latino heritage and her travels to Mexico, Central America, and beyond. She finds inspiration from Mexican artists including Frida Kahlo and photographer Graciela Iturbide, as well as the poetry of Octavio Paz, Jaime Sabines, and Lebanese writer/artist Kahlil Gibran.

Angélica will be graduating in the Spring of 2021. She plans to pursue an MFA that engages audiences through mixed media to shine a light on the experiences of people whose stories are often untold. Her photography has been featured in The New York Times, American Songwriter Magazine, and as cover art for albums and single records released by Warner Bros. Records.
