
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

Specifically, the Gilman Scholarship Program offers scholarships for students who have been traditionally underrepresented in education abroad.

Award recipients

receive up to \$5,000 to apply toward study abroad program costs, including program fees, tuition, room and board, airfare, books and local transportation.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Applicant must be a U.S. citizen undergraduate student at a 2 or 4 year institution in the United States.
- Applicant must be receiving a Federal Pell Grant at the time of application or during the term of study abroad.
- Applicant must be applying to a study abroad program eligible for credit at the student's institution of higher education in the U.S.
- Applicant must be studying abroad for a minimum of 4 weeks in one country.
- Study abroad program can take place in any country that is not on the U.S.


