AVSC 211: Unmanned Aircraft Operator Certification

Why? Anyone who will operate a drone in the US airspace should receive appropriate training and must be certified by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) in order to operate in a safe, equitable, and professional manner.

What? This course will prepare students to take the FAA Unmanned Aircraft General (UAG) Knowledge Test. After taking the passing the test, the student will apply to the FAA for the Remote Pilot Certification. Knowledge areas covered include regulations, airspace, flight restrictions, obstacle clearance, weather, weight and balance, emergency response, ADM, airport operations and radio communications, and the physiology of drugs and alcohol.
