CSE Name-Year System Citation Guide

The CSE Manual (8th ed., 2014)

This guide summarizes the standards developed by the Council of Science Editors (CSE) in *Scientific Style and Format: The CSE Manual for Authors, Editors, and Publishers*. It details formatting rules for three systems for citing references and in-text citations: Citation-Name, Citation-Sequence, and Name-Year. The Name-Year system is used here since it is the most common.

REFERENCES and IN-TEXT CITATION FORMAT

General Rules:

- 1. Author names are listed last name first, followed by initials (but without periods). Multiple authors are separated by a comma, and works with more than 10 authors use "et al." after the tenth author.
- 2. Organization authors are listed by their acronym in brackets, followed by the full name (see website example below).
- 3. For article and book title entries capitalize only the first word of the title and proper nouns.
- 4. Journal titles are listed using abbreviations based on ISO 4 standards (but without periods). Click on <u>Biological Journals</u> and <u>Abbreviations</u> for one such source.
- 5. Latin or scientific names that appear in the title are italicized (see master's thesis example below).

- Each in-text citation within the research paper must have a corresponding entry on the References page.
- All entries are double spaced and listed alphabetically by author's last name.
- Check with your professor whether to use a hanging indent or maintain a left-justified format.
