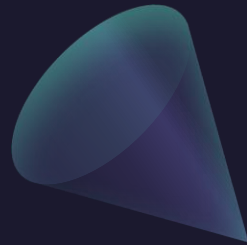

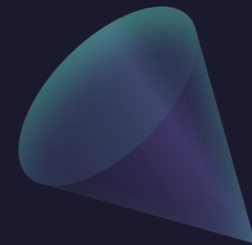
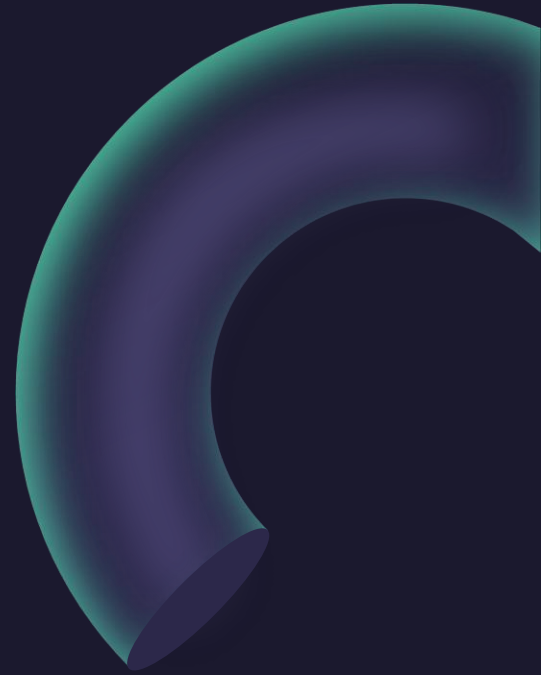

# Tips for Writing/Submitting an IRB Application

- Start early!
- Gather your resources
- Write clearly and technically
- Work closely with your PI (chair); have them review it before submission
- Follow the format/application
- Send in your best effort
- Submit a completed document (CITI certs, appendices, permissions, etc.)
- Be ready to respond to feedback quickly

# Considerations When Beginning Research

- What interests you? What would you like to learn more about? What are you passionate about? (marriage v dating)
- What is/are the problem(s)?
- What is your preferred research paradigm? Will this paradigm help you learn more about your topic?
- How familiar are you with the topic (scholarly literature and life experience)?
- Do you have to your research site? How easily could you get access?
- Do you and your chair work well together?
- When writing your RQs/hypothesis, are you wording them correctly? Are you asking/testing what you want to know?
- What research can you reasonably accomplish (in terms of personal timeline and data collection)?
- What is your ideal research approach/design (case study, intervention [pre-, post-], corpus review, etc.)
- Why is your proposed research significant? Who is your audience?
