

Topic: In an essay, analyze some aspect of *The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks*—from the perspective of language arts, history, science, culture, art, etc.

Length: 750-2,000 words

Format: MLA or APA style

Sources: Use of specific references to the text is required; use of references to other texts is optional. All must be cited.

Winners will present their essays and receive their prizes at the Spring 2015 Student Symposium on April 30, 2015.
