Nu Chapter History

The Industrial Education Club of the University of Maryland was organized during the school year 1938 - 39, on the campus of the University of Maryland under the sponsorship of Glen D. Brown and Ralph O. Gallington and with the whole hearted support of John J. Seidel and Charles W. Sylvester. The club grew rapidly and soon had a roster of 75 active members.

It was the original aim of the club to become affiliated with a national professional fraternity. On December 7, 1940, a petition for the establishment of a local chapter of Iota Lambda Sigma at the University of Maryland, College Park was submitted to the National Advisory Council of Iota Lambda Sigma for their consideration. The reaction of the National Advisory Council of Iota Lambda Sigma toward the petition submitted was favorable, and a charter was granted for a new chapter.

The Industrial Education Club of the University of Maryland was installed as the Nu Chapter of Iota Lambda Sigma on April 5, 1941. The ceremonies were conducted by the Iota Chapter, Millersville State Teacher's College, Pennsylvania. Seventy-one active members of the Industrial Club became charter members of Nu Chapter, Iota Lambda Sigma. There were also two honorary members, John J. Seidel and Charles W. Sylvester.

Since becoming affiliated with ILS., Nu Chapter has been moving steadily forward in all fields. Among its members can be found many of the leaders in career and technology education and workforce development in the State of Maryland.
